#### **Ticket Policies**

Season tickets available beginning in May 2010. Individual tickets available August 16. There are no refunds on tickets unless an event is cancelled and not rescheduled. Refunds are made to the original purchaser only. Exchanges are available to season subscribers at no cost. Tickets must be returned to the ticket office at least 48 hours prior to performance in order to exchange them for another event in the current season. We make every effort to seat you with friends. Please include all ticket orders on one form. Tickets will be mailed to the person placing the order. Regardless of age, everyone must have a ticket and sit in a seat. If you are unsure whether a performance is suitable for your child, please call the ticket office for a recommendation.

#### **Ticket Office Hours**



October 1, 2010



October 9, 2010



## BARRAGE - November 12, 2010






# **SPAMALOT - Nov. 30 - Dec. 1, 2010**




# CAPE TOWN PHILHARMONIC ORCHESTRA


